

Prosodic phrasing and information structure

To date, most work concerned with the interface between syntax and prosody has been concerned with focus marking. This paper argues that prosodic phrasing, both on the level of the intonation unit (IU) and the intonational phrase (ip), is of relevance to a much broader range of phenomena relating to information structure (or perhaps better: information management). Data will come mostly from Waima'a (East Timor) (and possibly also from Wooi).
